Engaging students during the 2021 Summer of Fun program at Hillhouse and continuing with programming during the school year. Through bonding activities (e.g., group discussions, cooking, trips) involving talks revolving around self-awareness, self-love, self-care, self-esteem, and responsible decision-making to pursue their dreams and achieve their goals. The contractor also supported YFCE during the Back to School Rally in 2022.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>INCREASED ATTENDANCE</u> • When working with Brown Girls Cooking and Conversation, a group of (20) female students with high absenteeism rates were assigned to work with Demiteria. 2021-22, these students missed a total combined 243 days from school. This year, the group has missed 189 days, improving attendance by 22% through programming efforts established by Demiteria and her team.

With the help of professional instructors, the aim is to provide an artistic platform to stimulate learning and provide firsthand experiences in artistic themes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>POSITIVE STUDENT RETENTION</u> • Serviced a total of 40 towns across the state of CT. Reaching over 48,000 students directly and indirectly (Virtually). Successfully have completed servicing 10 NHPS Schools. Currently Servicing 2 Schools, 60 students at Wexler and 40 Brennan Rogers students per site.

Music Note Kids club provides social-emotional learning, scientific-based hands-on activities, arts and crafts, and theatre activities at school sites. Through this exposure, students are engaged and allowed students to express themselves. Throughout the years, recorded retention shows a high level of participation by maintaining a 1:10 staff-to-student ratio.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>INCREASED ATTENDANCE & EXPRESSIVE ARTS</u> • The Music note Kid club has provided quality hands-on programming for our students here at Davis. Joseph and his team have been able to teach students expression through puppets and acting classes. Skills can be transformed to support the students with their career development. The music note club actively engages our students while teaching and having fun. This program is recommended for younger students who are still exploring their interests.



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CTVIP	Community-Based Outreach organization	Mon-Sat.	100	Evaluation to be completed February-May	CT VIP has worked with numerous NHPS students and educators in the building and out in the community to support the needs of the students. They have also expanded their efforts to support adult education centers in the area and continued partnership with Yale New Haven Hospital to attend to shooting victims. Targeting individuals ages 13-26, CTVIP strives to maintain relationships with participants who have aged out to keep ties within the community.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>MENTORING, VIOLENCE PREVENTION, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT</u> • Mr. Jahad and his team have worked in New Haven for the past seven years to support youth across the city. CT VIP has been observed in several situations that have allowed us to witness firsthand their dedication to the field of social justice and his willingness to do what it takes to ensure that students rise to their full potential. CT VIP is a valued organization in our community whom we have learned we can rely on, regardless of the difficulty of the task to hand or the novelty of the challenge.



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Ice the Beef	Community-Based Outreach organization, Barnard, Jepson, Riverside	3 days a week and Saturdays	50	Evaluation to be completed February-May	Ice the Beef partnered with Riverside in January 2022 and has demonstrated tremendous effectiveness in mediating student conflict in and out of school. Since their arrival in Riverside, there was immediate traction in developing positive connections. Students would seek any of them out whenever they needed support. They would do home visits to identify students' needs and why they are not attending school. Ice the beef is working in collaboration with the attendance team and administration. Ice the Beef has been a tremendous asset in improving student attendance. Currently, they will be working with 25 students from both Jeapson and Barnard to promote positive behaviors and mentoring to support staff in the building.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>MENTORING, VIOLENCE PREVENTION, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT</u> • Ice the Beef took part in a pilot of the Aces/LEAP program to combat chronic absenteeism. Ice the Beef visited 3,703 families by phone and at their homes as needed. On our second visit, we visited 2,681 families, third visit, 2,065 families. The resource team made 3,207 connections that led to determining the needs of families.

Reshica and her team provide grade-level appropriate programming that aids students with homework help, literacy supports/read-out-loud, and games that correlate with educational lessons. Also, they have provided enrichment activities ranging from Culinary, Karate, arts/crafts, and sports/physical activities. The Kidz Kraze has a great connection with parents and the community and continues to support the needs within the building.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>EXPANSION PRE-K PROGRAMMING & AFTER SCHOOL SUPPORTS</u> • Currently servicing 3 Schools, 25 students per site at Celentano, East Rock, and Jepson. Kidz Kraze has completed the program during the 21-22 SY at Wexler and East Rock. A total of 115 students were successfully serviced (75 at Wexler and 40 at East Rock)

Staff trained in mentoring, community engagement, and development. Holistic approaches determine the needs of the students, knowing that there could be more factors outside of school that could impact overall student progression. Kiyama supports personal and professional development through exposure to various activities. This year, Kiyama has been using graduates from their program who are juniors and seniors to mentor younger students. The wrap-around services provided to students ensure they receive the needed dosage to support their needs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>MENTORING AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT</u> • Kiyama has successfully provided 25 students from Hill House in 21-22 SY with mentoring support and exposure to various activities across the state and surrounding states. Continuing efforts with 25 Wilbur Cross students during the 22-23 SY, they have continued to provide positive reinforcements to support the needs of students in school and out in the community.

Students are engaged through sports such as basketball and learn how to play the game of chess and how it connects with everyday life lessons. SPORT academy engages with students in a positive matter and continues to build strong connections. SPORT Academy continues to build a strong bond with staff, families, and students within the NHPS system to assist students with their overall needs. The schools continue to request the services SPORT academy offers to assure students are receiving a high level of programming.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>MENTORING AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT</u> • SPORT Academy has provided mentoring and programming support through basketball and chess lessons at Roberto Clemente during the 21-22 SY. After-school programming has been expanded to 3 other NHPS sites to enhance lessons for students. Outside NHPS partnership, SPORT ACADEMY has serviced High Villa and Stetson Library for an additional 60 students. The agency has provided quality programming and has high retention and participation rates.
