  - i. The contractor will address the needs to enhance character development and fundamental culinary skills to assure students are able to apply this information outside of schools hours.
  - ii. Services will be monitored using the APT tool, which assess the overall quality of the programs staffing, staff's engagement with students and families, collaboration with NHPS staff, transitioning of students and activities offered. The evaluation team consist of the Building Leader with a team, which may consist of other NHPS staff, parents and community members. APT raters observe and score staff interactions (manner, affect, and tone of voice) with youth and families. The observers rate areas such as:
    - 1. Are staffs greeting students and families
    - 2. Transitioning of students
    - 3. Does the space provide appropriate room for all youth and staff?
    - 4. The ability of staffs to communication with youth and/or their families in their language(s).
    - 5. The support staff provide in assisting youth with organizing and preparing themselves to do their homework.
    - 6. Staffs adjustments and accommodations for students based on their experiences and needs and that
    - 7. Staffs use of simple reminders and redirection to support positive behaviors.
    - 8. Dismissal Process

- i. Students will engage in programming that will improve critical thinking skills while learning cooking fundamental skills. Opportunities that are important to the child's development. Programs like these are especially important in urban areas where children do not have the same access, exposure, and experiences as their suburban peers.
- 12. Why do you believe this Agreement is fiscally sound?
  - a. This agreement provides students and families the opportunity to engage in programming while learning new skills that will enhance their development. At a price of \$180 a session, this agreement provides tremendous values to the needs of students at Celentano at an affordable price.
- 13. What are the implications of not approving this Agreement?
  - a. Students at Celentano will not be granted the opportunity to participate in activities that build important developmental factors. Without these types of opportunities, we are limiting the activities we provide to our youth. Lack of support could lead to increased risk of youth engaging in negative activities outside of their parents/guardian's supervision.

# AGREEMENT By And Between The New Haven Board of Education AND

This Agreement entered into on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December 2022, effective (<u>no sooner than the day after Board of Education Approval</u>), the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2023, by and between the New Haven Board of Education (herein referred to as the "Board" and, Grace Fixins, LLC located at, 432 Eastern St, Apt. 2B, New Haven, CT, 06513 (herein referred to as the "Contractor".

Compensation: The Board shall pay the contractor for satisfactory performance of services required the amount of \$ 180.00 per session, for a total of 47sessions.

The maximum amount the contractor shall be paid under this agreement: Eighy Thousand, Four Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$ 8,460.00). Compensation will be made upon submission of <u>an</u> itemized invoice which includes a detailed description of work performed and date of service.

HOLD HARMLESS: The Contractor shall insure and/or indemnify the Board and its members, employees and agents against all claims, suits, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, in connection with loss of life, bodily injury or property damage arising from any neglect act or omission of the Contractor or its employees or agents. Further, the Contractor covenants and agrees that it shall hold the Board and its members, employees and agents harmless against any and all claims, suits judgments of any description whatsoever caused by the Contractor' breach of this agreement or based upon the conduct of the Contractor, or its agents or its employees or arising out of in connection with their activities under this agreement.

TERMINATION: The Board may cancel this agreement for any reason upon thirty (30) days' written notice sent to the Contractor by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested; provided however, that the Board shall be responsible to the Contractor for all services rendered by the Contractor through the last day of thirty (30) day notice period, as long as the Agreement was approved by the Board prior to the start date of service.

### EXHIBIT B

# STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student- generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student-generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within two (2) business days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student(s) whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student-generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.





### To whom it may concern:

I welcome the opportunity to express my interest in inviting Ruthann Lowers-Smith (Graced Fixins LLC) to provide home economics and life skill services to the students at Celentano Biotech, Health and Medical Magnet School. I had the pleasure of meeting Mrs. Lowers-Smith in 2019 when I was the principal of West Rock Stream Academy. Mrs. Lowers-Smith volunteered her time providing cooked meals for families who were food insecure. Unfortunately, the school closed due to air quality issues related to Covid-19 building standards. However, Mrs. Lowers-Smith would drop off meals for families in need and work privately with some families to teach their children how to make healthy meals for themselves as most parents were working two jobs and students were often home alone.

In 2021, I became the principal of Celentano School and Mrs. Lowers-Smith contacted me to let me know she started a small business teaching students how to cook healthy meals, mentoring tween and teenage students as a life coach. Mrs. Lowers-Smith also expressed she realized after volunteering her cooking and mentoring talents with members of her neighborhood and church communities, she wanted to turn this passion into a business to reach more youths. She also stated she wanted to work with students in an afterschool program to provide a home economic experience for students. I feel this program would benefit the students at Celentano to provide another opportunity for our middle school students to engage in positive socialization and emotional development.

At Celentano, we have a high percentage of families who are food insecure and although two meals are provided daily, a percentage of my students leave my school not knowing if they will have a meal at home. I believe that Graced Fixins would be another layer of support for these students. They would be able to not only learn how to prepare healthy meals for themselves and discuss life skills but, they would leave the school having had another meal.
