This Agreement entered into on the 12th day of December, 2022, effective (<u>no sooner than the day after Board of Education Approval</u>), the 13th day of December, 2022, by and between the New Haven Board of Education (herein referred to as the "Board" and Javaughn Harris located at, 334 West Division Street, New Haven CT 06511 (herein referred to as the "Contractor").

Contractor will facilitate curriculum that:

- Increases student interest and participation through relevant and meaningful hands-on learning.
- Creates a safe and open environment for students to express and discuss issues that have a negative impact on their everyday life.
- Provides an alternative to traditional classroom learning.
- Equips students with basic knowledge and skills to operate within the ever growing digital and creative field.

• Gives students a forum to further explore their interests and build a foundation for their future planning.

This program will run three days a week - Monday, Wednesday, Friday from 12:30pm -2:00pm at Wilbur Cross High School. During this time, students will learn and create digital content while they continue to develop and learn who they are and who they want to become as young adults in the world.

Strategies will include:

- Weekly open and safe discussions and debates of students' choice
- Character building exercises and activities
- Vision boarding and future planning
- One-on-one check-ins with each student
- Regular check-ins with student teams
- Professional speakers on authentic topics
- Opportunities for application of new learning related to topics from speakers
- Digital literacy learning strategies
- Audio and video Podcast Creation
- Basic video editing and production skill building
- Digital Design and positive social media usage
- Provide brief counseling sessions with students who are experiencing symptoms that interrupt school engagement due to trauma, neglect, abuse, or maltreatment.
- Work closely with school administration and teaching staff for the purpose of understanding student symptoms that cause learning interference and apply support as needed.

At the completion of this project, At the completion of the program, students will have learned the basic digital skills needed to operate in a growing creative and digital space as well as created multiple projects and presentations showcasing their skills. Engagement with this digital media project will support student character development, build confidence, and focus for their future. Student projects will include a review of projects alongside the NHPS 21st Century Competencies. These projects may result in foundational pieces or fully completed Capstone Projects.

EXHIBIT B

STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

For the purposes of this Exhibit B "directory information," "de-identified student information," "school purposes," "student information," "student records," "student- generated content," and "targeted advertising" shall be as defined by Conn. Gen. Stat.§10-234aa.

- 1. All student records, student information, and student-generated content (collectively, "student data") provided or accessed pursuant this Agreement or any other services agreement between the Parties are not the property of, or under the control of, the Contractor.
- 2. The Board shall have access to and the ability to delete student data in the possession of the Contractor except in instances where such data is (A) otherwise prohibited from deletion or required to be retained under state or federal law, or (B) stored as a copy as part of a disaster recovery storage system and that is (i) inaccessible to the public, and (ii) unable to be used in the normal course of business by the Contractor. The Board may request the deletion of any such student information, student records or student-generated content if such copy has been used by the operator to repopulate accessible data following a disaster recovery. The Board may request the deletion of student data by the contractor within two (2) business days of receiving such a request and provide to the Board confirmation via electronic mail that the student data has been deleted in accordance with the request, the date of its deletion, and the manner in which it has been deleted. The confirmation shall contain a written assurance from the Contractor that proper disposal of the data has occurred in order to prevent the unauthorized access or use of student data and that deletion has occurred in accordance with industry standards/practices/protocols.
- 3. The Contractor shall not use student data for any purposes other than those authorized pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. A student, parent or legal guardian of a student may review personally identifiable information contained in student data and correct any erroneous information, if any, in such student data. If the Contractor receives a request to review student data in the Contractor's possession directly from a student, parent, or guardian, the Contractor agrees to refer that individual to the Board and to notify the Board within two (2) business days of receiving such a request. The Contractor agrees to work cooperatively with the Board to permit a student, parent, or guardian to review personally identifiable information in student data that has been shared with the Contractor, and correct any erroneous information therein.

- 5. The Contractor shall take actions designed to ensure the security and confidentiality of student data.
- 6. The Contractor will notify the Board, in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 10-234dd, when there has been an unauthorized release, disclosure or acquisition of student data. Such notification will include the following steps:

Upon discovery by the Contractor of a breach of student data, the Contractor shall conduct an investigation and restore the integrity of its data systems and, without unreasonable delay, but not more than thirty (30) days after such discovery, shall provide the Board with a more detailed notice of the breach, including but not limited to the date and time of the breach; name(s) of the student(s) whose student data was released, disclosed or acquired; nature of and extent of the breach; and measures taken to ensure that such a breach does not occur in the future.

- 7. Student data shall not be retained or available to the Contractor upon expiration of the contract between the Contractor and Board, except a student, parent or legal guardian of a student may choose independently to establish or maintain an electronic account with the Contractor after the expiration of such contract for the purpose of storing student-generated content.
- 8. The Contractor and Board shall each ensure their own compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, as amended from time to time.
- 9. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees to comply with the above and all other applicable aspects of Connecticut's Student Data Privacy law according to Connecticut General Statutes §§ 10-234aa through 10-234dd.
- 10. The Parties agree that this Agreement controls over any inconsistent terms or conditions contained within any other agreement entered into by the Parties concerning student data.

Is the current circle of friends I'm around pushing me towards my dreams and aspirations?

Do I feel motivated to become the best version of myself around my current friends?

(PERSONAL Brand BASICS) The Come Up:

Personal branding is a powerful tool that enables individuals to become successful over time. Personal branding establishes a person's identity whether professionally or personally. Brand matters, people's perception of others influence the opportunities available to them as well. In this workshop, the definition and creation of personal brands for participants will be explored along with helpful tips on how to maintain a personal brand. Through kinesthetic activities & pop culture participants will be able to walk away with a flushed out foundation of their personal brand.

Major Key Alert: A Global Leadership Perspective

From Snap Chat to the entertainment world, Dj Khaled has taken his trade mark "Major Keys" Global. He has an appeal that reaches across cultural barriers, prepare to "WIN" like Khaled. This session will focus on what it means to be a global citizen as it pertains to leadership. Participants will be exposed to cultural competence as well global perspectives. Diary Of A Beautiful Struggle: One Man Show- A new one man show dedicated to life and the beauty and pain that we experience daily as human beings. This one-man performance by critically acclaimed artist Frank E.Brady will touch on issues and themes such as identity, love, misogyny, hardships,

relationships & more. Frank uses his skills as a poet, musician, orator and emcee to portray the beautiful and the ugly in life that makes us human.

Blackened History: What You Never Knew- (Spring 2011) An interactive PowerPoint theatrical presentation that fuses education of black history with the performing arts to enlighten the audience on black history not traditionally found in the textbooks. The presentation comes to life with monologues, spoken word, songs, instruments and passion in an effort to take the celebration and entertainment experience to the next level.

Motivational & Keynote Speaking:
