#### **Summary of Grant History:**

This grantor, Qatar Foundation International, first funded Arabic instruction in NHPS during the 2018-19 school year with a full-time position at Wilbur Cross High School. In 2019-20, they again funded the Wilbur Cross position and supported part of the FAME (Columbus) part-time Arabic position. In 2020-21, we were able to move the Wilbur Cross Arabic position to General Funds when a world language opening became available. In 2020-21, QFI paid for 100% of a part-time Arabic teacher at FAME; in 2021-22, they paid for a full-time itinerant teacher between FAME and Celentano. This year, we are able to move that position to general funds.

This year, we are asking QFI to continue to fund a part-time Arabic position at Jepson to ensure that they can have a K-8 Arabic program. We have added a request for funding for an Arabic Festival and staff activity as well the Annual Wilbur Cross Arabic Festival. In addition, Hill Regional Career has requested to have Arabic language instruction due to their rising Arabic speaker population. This part-time teacher will be able to interact with Arabic speakers and families, organize an Arabic Festival, and provide Arabic instruction to new learners.

On the attached budget submitted to QFI, you can see how the amounts and percentages are described in the grant application. Here is a written explanation of what QFI will fund, if the grant is received:

#### **Personnel:**

#### **Part-Time Salary and Fixed Costs**

The grant covers 100% of the salary and fixed costs for a part-time Arabic teacher for grades 1-5 for Jepson (\$17,550, plus \$1,342.58 FICA, plus \$119.34 Workman's Compensation), as well as a part-time Arabic teacher for Hill Regional Career (\$13,500 for 15 hours/week, plus \$1,032 FICA, plus \$91.80 Workman's compensation)

#### **Non-Personnel Items:**

#### Arabic Festival:

The grant includes \$1,000 each for Arabic Festivals at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, and Jepson. This includes \$600 for supplies (craft supplies, paper plates, food, etc.) and. All students learning Arabic districtwide will be invited to the different festivals. In addition, we requested \$200 in food supplies for a staff event a Jepson, to help the staff learn more about the Arabic Language and Culture to support the K-8 program.

#### **Independent Consultants:**

\$1200 in funds to pay for a professional performers for the Arabic Festivals and a guest speaker honorarium for the speaker at the Jepson staff event.

#### \*In-Kind Contributions

#### **Full-Time Teachers:**

QFI allows NHPS to use the <u>existing</u> world languages general funds positions of the Arabic teacher at Wilbur Cross, the Arabic itinerant between FAME and Celentano, and the Arabic Teacher at Jepson Grades 6-8 as an in-kind contribution toward this grant (no additional cost to NHPS).

#### Attendance at Poetry Contest and Rhyme Celebration:

Using Title IVA funds, NHPS will provide 100% of the costs of transportation and entry fees for students in these Arabic programs to attend the Connecticut Council of Language Teacher's Rhyme Celebration and Poetry Contest.

#### **Classroom Supplies:**

The schools will provide up to \$500 of consumable supplies for instruction, such as paper, notecards, crayons, colored pencils, etc.

During the 2023-24 school year, the Arabic program will:

- Offer Arabic instruction in grades K-8 at Jepson with the help of a part-timer for the younger grades. This will enable students to build skills at a younger age and expand their opportunity to reach a high level of proficiency by the end of high school, up to the Seal of Biliteracy level.
- Hold an "Arabic Festival" at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, and Jepson to celebrate the language and culture citywide, as well as other special events to build and showcase the program.
- Act as a support and resource for Arabic-speaking students and families at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, Jepson, Celentano, FAME, ESUMS, and other Arabic speaking families in the district.

During the 2022-23 year, the QFI grant funded the following:

- Engaged 39 students in grades 6-8 in Arabic instruction at FAME and Celentano with Itinerant teacher, Soha Osman. She also engaged students and families through Padlets, phone calls, and videos of students speaking Arabic.
- Engaged all students at Jepson in the learning of Arabic our first K-8 sequential program.
- The Wilbur Cross Arabic Festival will be held on May 26<sup>th</sup>, with attendance by students from FAME, Celentanto and Jepson.

#### 3. How does this grant address School Reform goals?

Through this grant, students have the opportunity to begin language study in kindergarten, thereby making it more likely that they attain Level IV and/or the Seal of Biliteracy in high school. In addition, having a part-time Arabic speaker at Hill Regional Career High School will allow us to better engage families who speak Arabic there while offering another language choice to students. As a less-commonly taught language, Arabic is a unique language to have on high school transcripts, possibly increasing students' college acceptance potential. It opens doors to careers and opportunities in our New Haven community and worldwide.

In addition, students who learn Arabic at Wilbur Cross, Hill Regional Career, FAME, Celentano, Jepson, and ESUMS, will have the opportunity to attend the various Arabic Festivals and experience the food, dance, and culture of the Arabic-speaking world as they apply what they have learned in classes. These experiences build school <u>Culture and Climate</u> by increasing understanding of our Middle Eastern and Moslem students.
