1. Please state specific goals for this grant or the grant period.

One of the key strategies to reduce the digital divide for New Haven students during the COVID-19 pandemic was the deployment of the 'mesh' Wi-Fi network to the most underserved neighborhoods. Unfortunately, stress testing shows that the current system of wireless access controllers and wireless access points are too old and lack the capacity to handle both a large number of wireless devices inside the building and a large amount of network traffic coming in through the mesh network. Two of these wireless access controller systems are already at their fail point, with another two systems also in need of replacement in the very near future.

Our goal is to invest in the long-term health of our wireless internet infrastructure by replacing the outdated and failing wireless access points and controllers that allow our students and staff to access the network. This includes the following:

- Wireless access controllers and access points: hardware for the wireless network
- Enterprise licenses: software to control the network
- Installation labor: costs to install and set up the network

Providing free wireless internet and access to the district's network is not only essential now for remote learning during the pandemic, but for any true 21st Century connected learning in this day and age. When students have reliable and efficient Wi-Fi, they are more engaged in their learning, and have access to hundreds of online programs and tools that are proven to improve academic outcomes. Using this grant to replace outdated and failing wireless access points and controllers will extend our coverage to reach more of our students now and into the future as we prepare for potential hybrid settings and eventually full returns as well.
